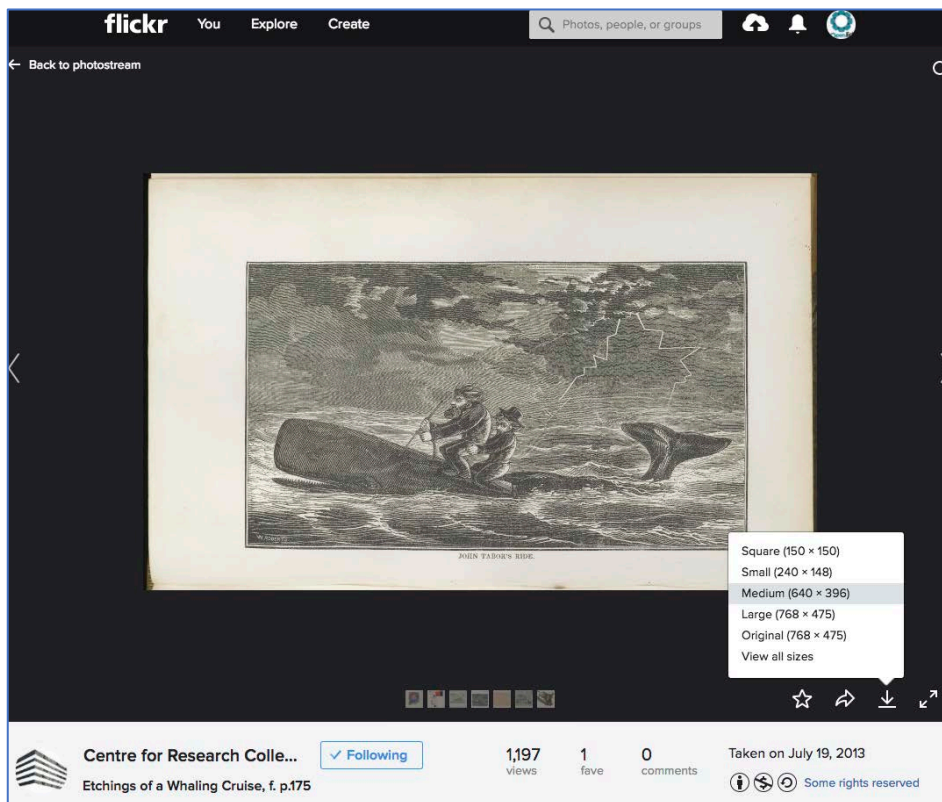


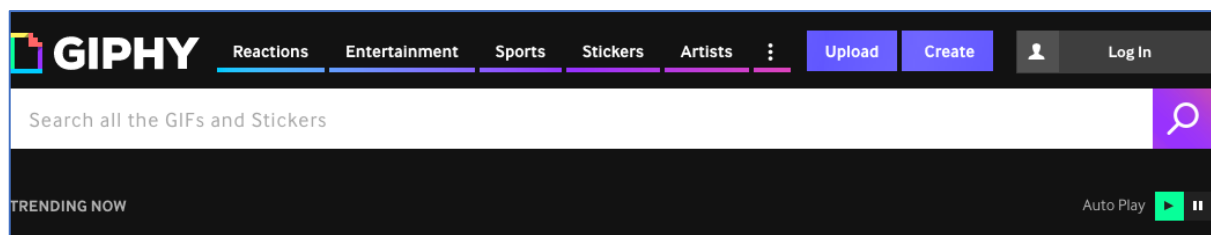
Adding stickers and effects

Gif It Up – A workshop on creating gifs run by [Open.Ed](http://open.ed.ac.uk/) at The University of Edinburgh

1. In your browser window go to <http://edin.ac/2CnRaU3> and download the image by clicking on the arrow button. Choose the download size 'Medium (640 x 463)'.



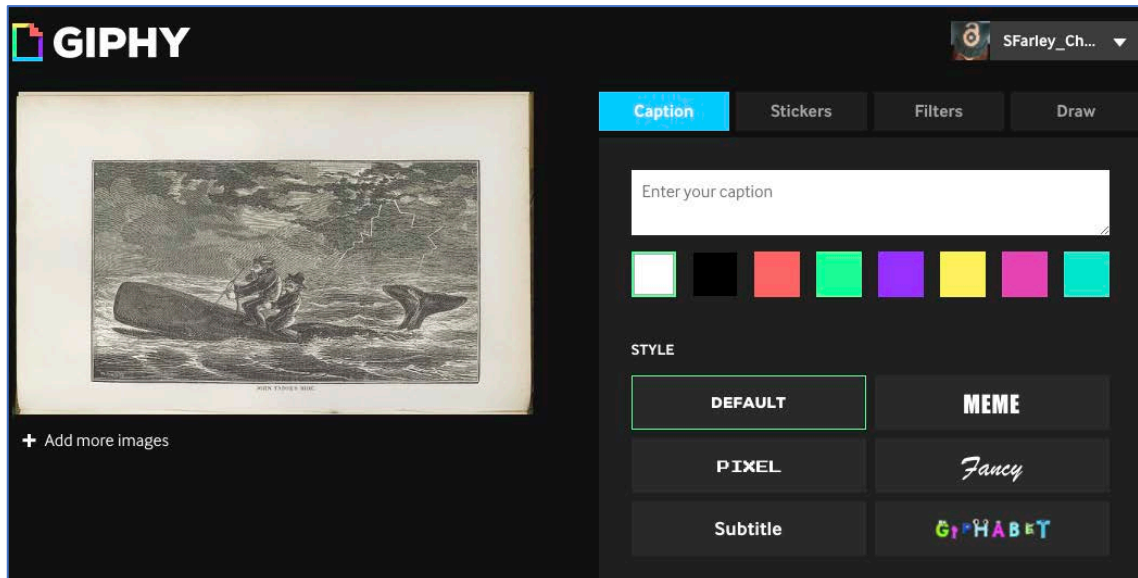
2. In another browser tab to go Giphy.com <https://giphy.com/>. You can choose to sign in with an account or not. Having an account can be useful for tracking the gifs you create.



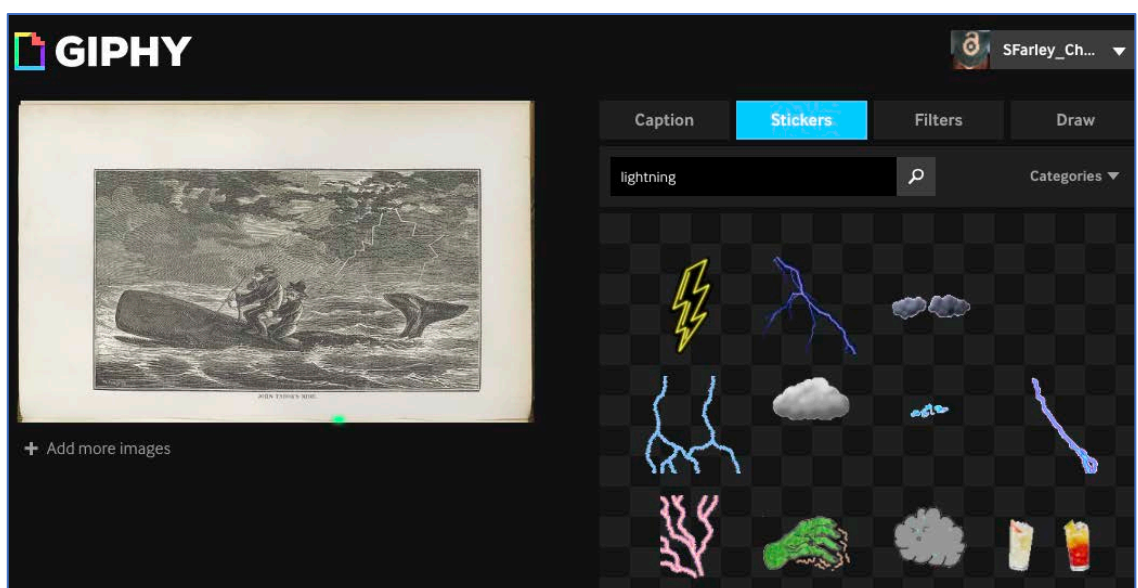

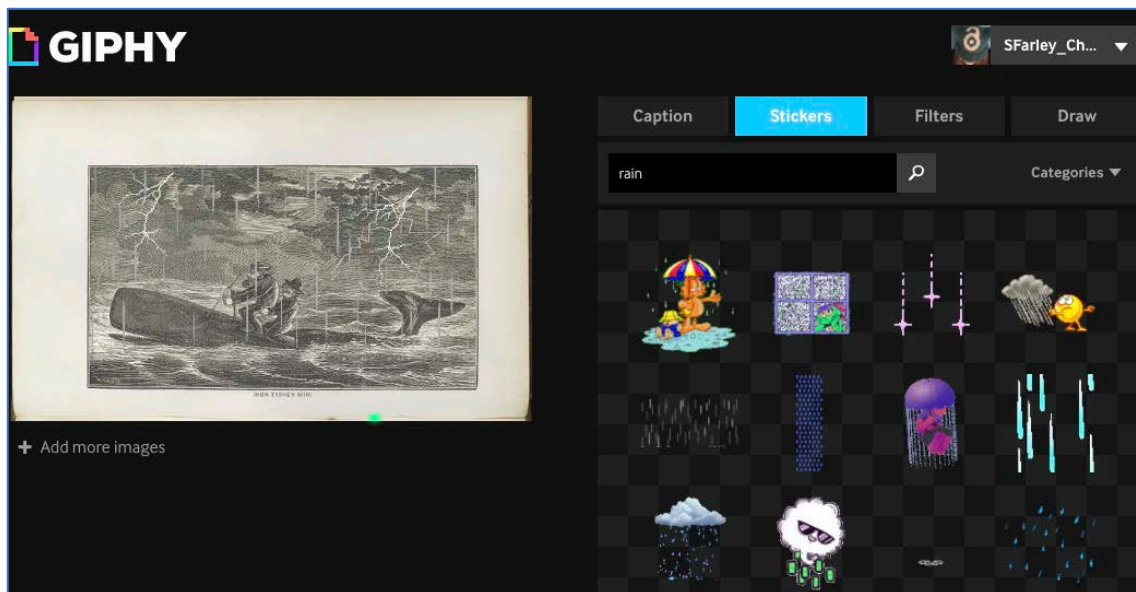
3. Click on Create. You have the option of uploading a photo, existing gif, or a video. For now, upload the image we just saved.



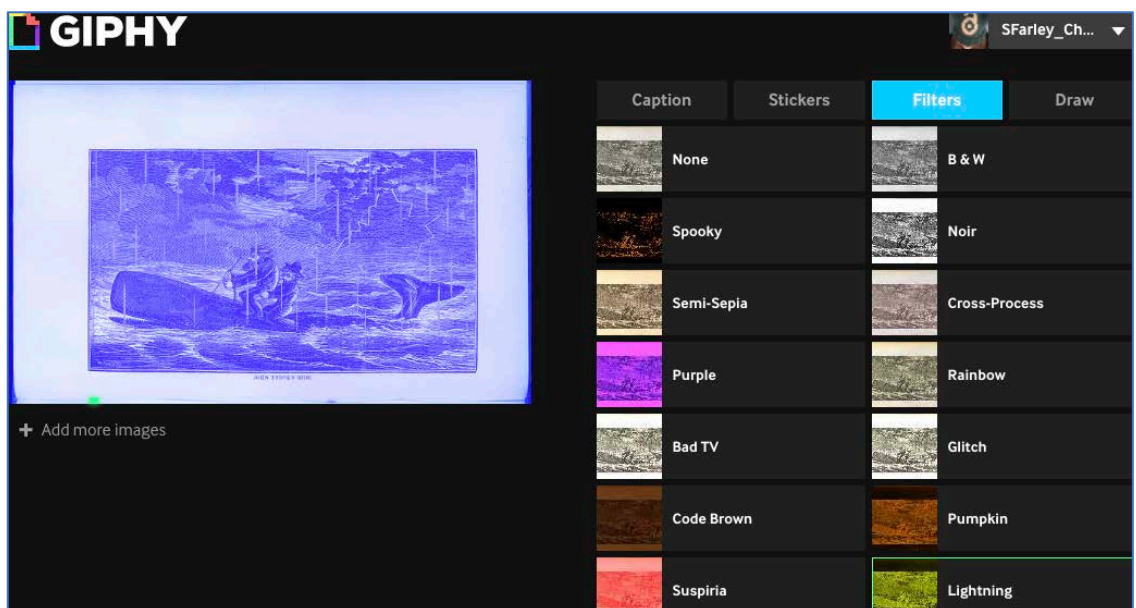
4. Click on the 'Stickers' tab, and type 'lightning' into the search box.
5. Click on one of the lightning stickers of your choice. This will place it on the image. Now you can drag, drop, and resize the stickers to fit your image.



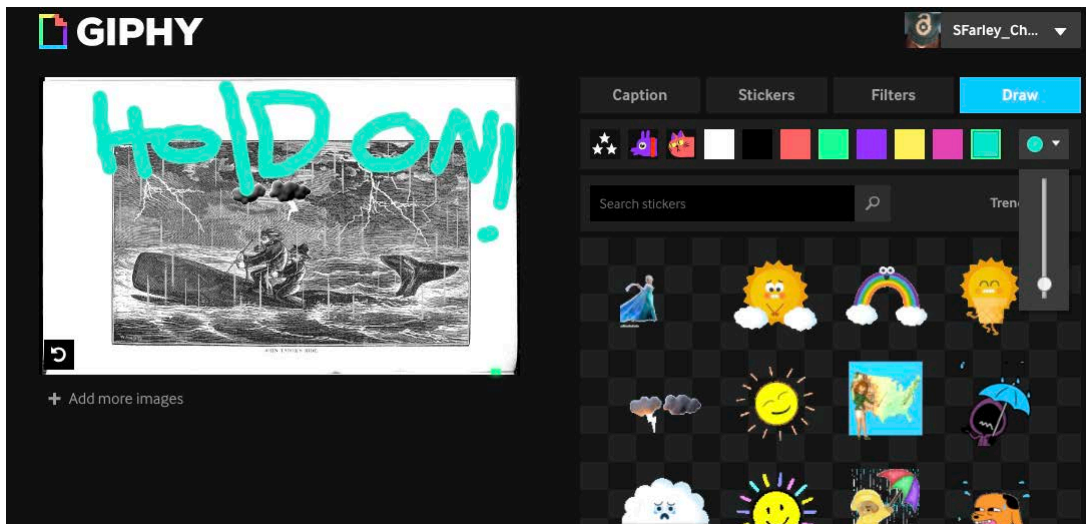
6. Search for other stickers, such as 'rain' or 'storm' to find stickers and add them to your gif.



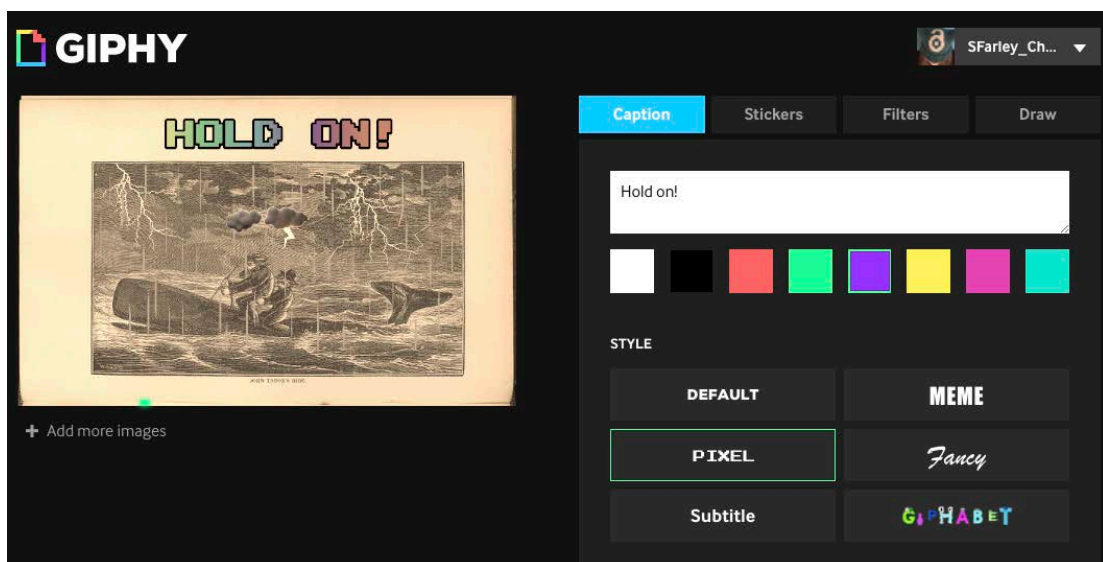
7. Let's add a filter! Click on the 'Filters' tab and play around by selecting different filters to see how they look on your gif.



8. Great, now for some freestyle. Click on the 'Draw' tab, select a colour and play around with drawing onto your gif.

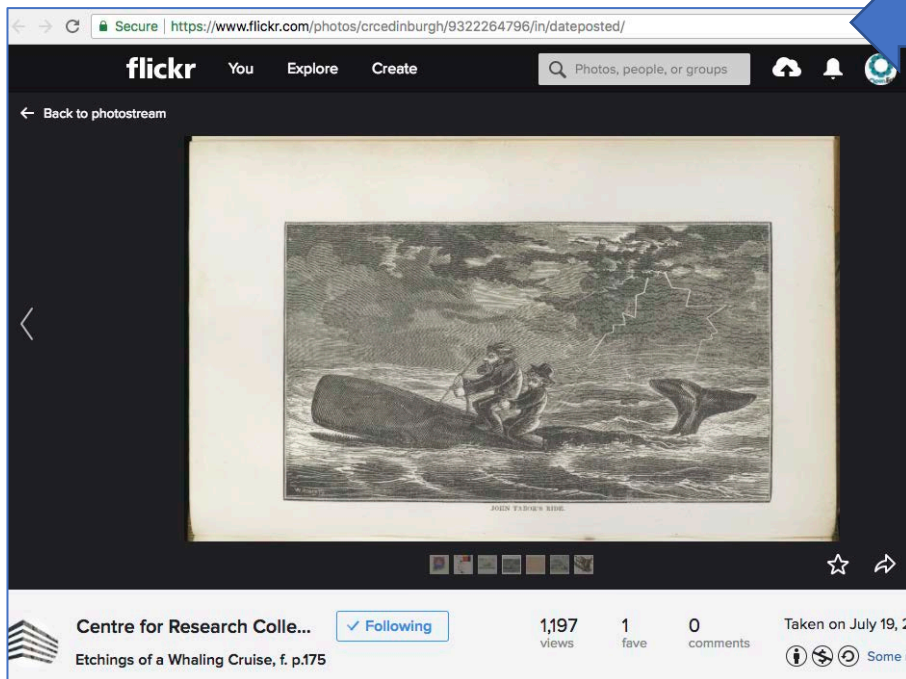


9. Change the size of your brush by clicking on the dot showing the colour you chose and moving the slider up and down. Play with click on then dragging the stars or one of the cartoon characters across your gif. Keep your drawing, or clear it by clicking on the reverse or undo symbol on the bottom left corner of your gif.
10. Click on the 'Caption' tab and type into the white text box underneath. Try different Style and Animation options to see how they change the look of your gif. You may also find that you want to change the filter you selected earlier.

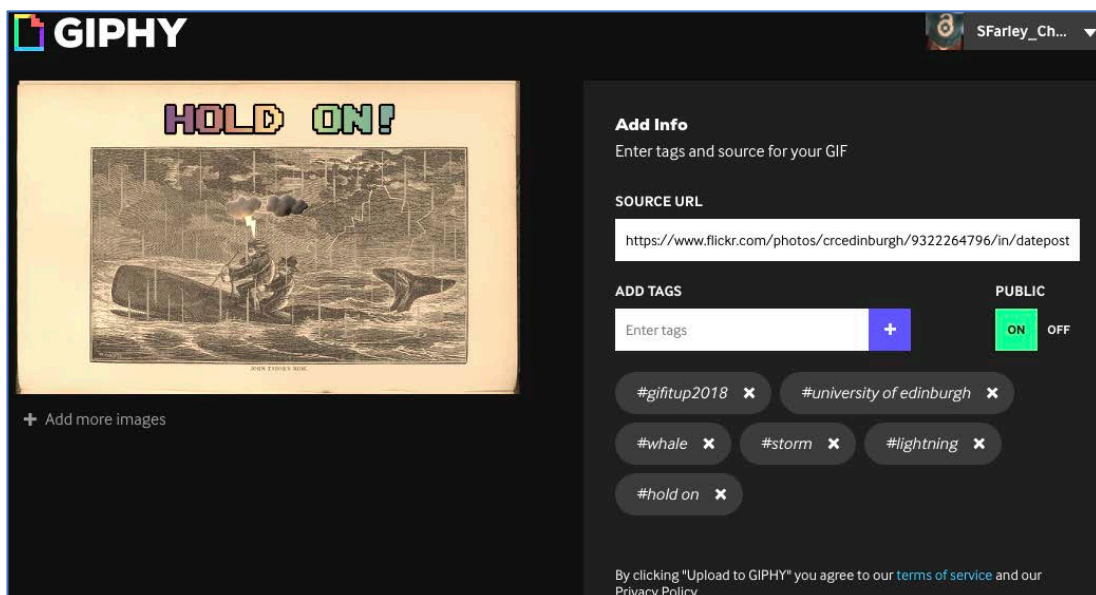


11. When you're ready to save your gif, click on the 'Continue to Upload' button at the bottom of the page.

12. Giphy will then ask you to add some information. Go back to the browser tab with the original image and copy the url/web address at the top of the page, this is the Source URL.



13. Add the Source URL to the information on Giphy. Then add the tag Gifitup2018, University of Edinburgh, and any additional tags you think would help someone find your gif, making sure to hit the + button to add your tag.



14. When you're ready click 'Upload to Giphy'. And done, you've created and shared a gif. Well done!

15. If you're logged in with an account on Giphy you'll be able to see the new gif in your channel.
