

How to allow downloads on Media Hopper

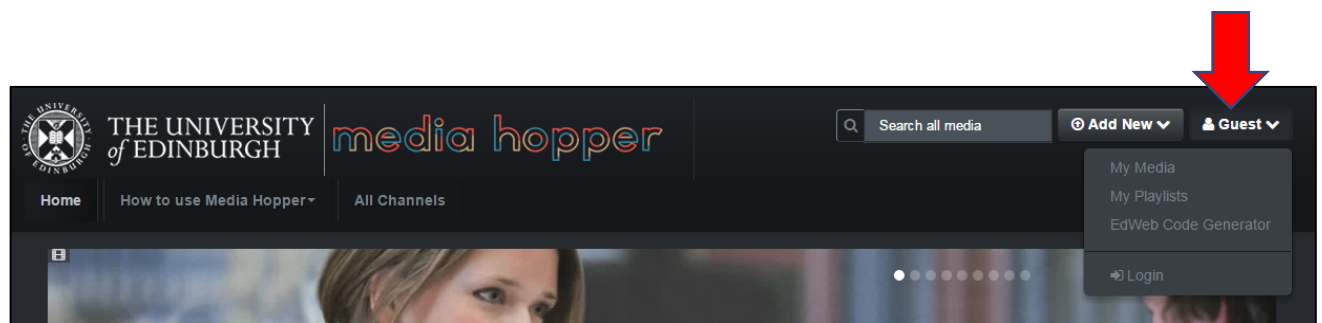
In this document we describe how to allow downloads of your Media Hopper video or media file.

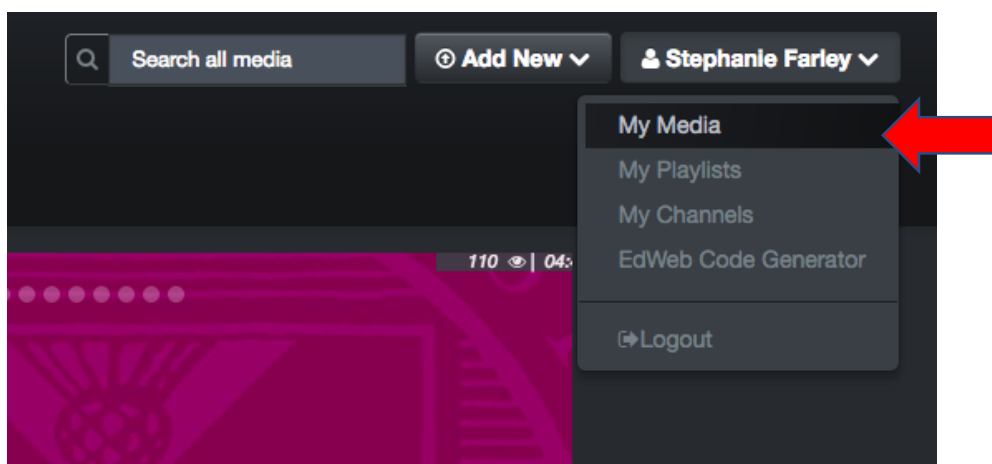
Allowing downloads on Media Hopper

1. Go to <http://media.ed.ac.uk>

On the top right of the page click on the drop down button 'Guest' and select 'login'. You will be directed to log in using your EASE details.

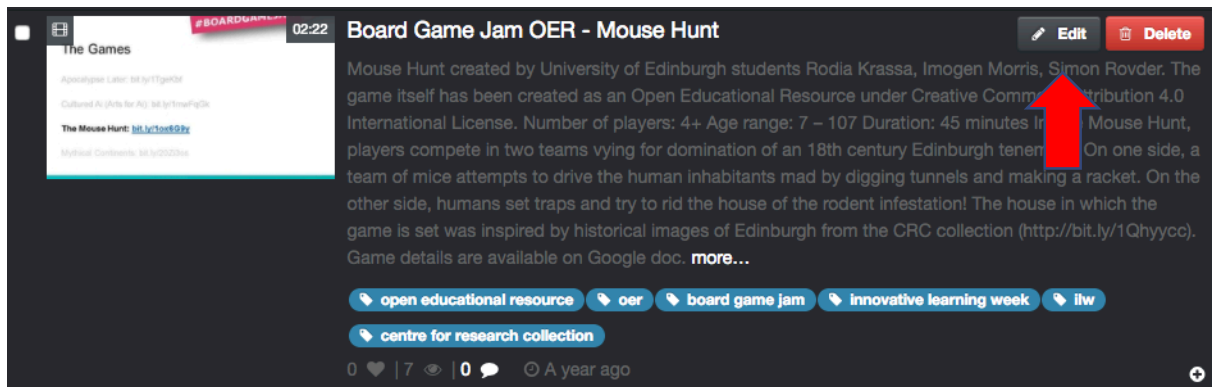


2. Click on the drop down button of your name, and click on 'My Media'.



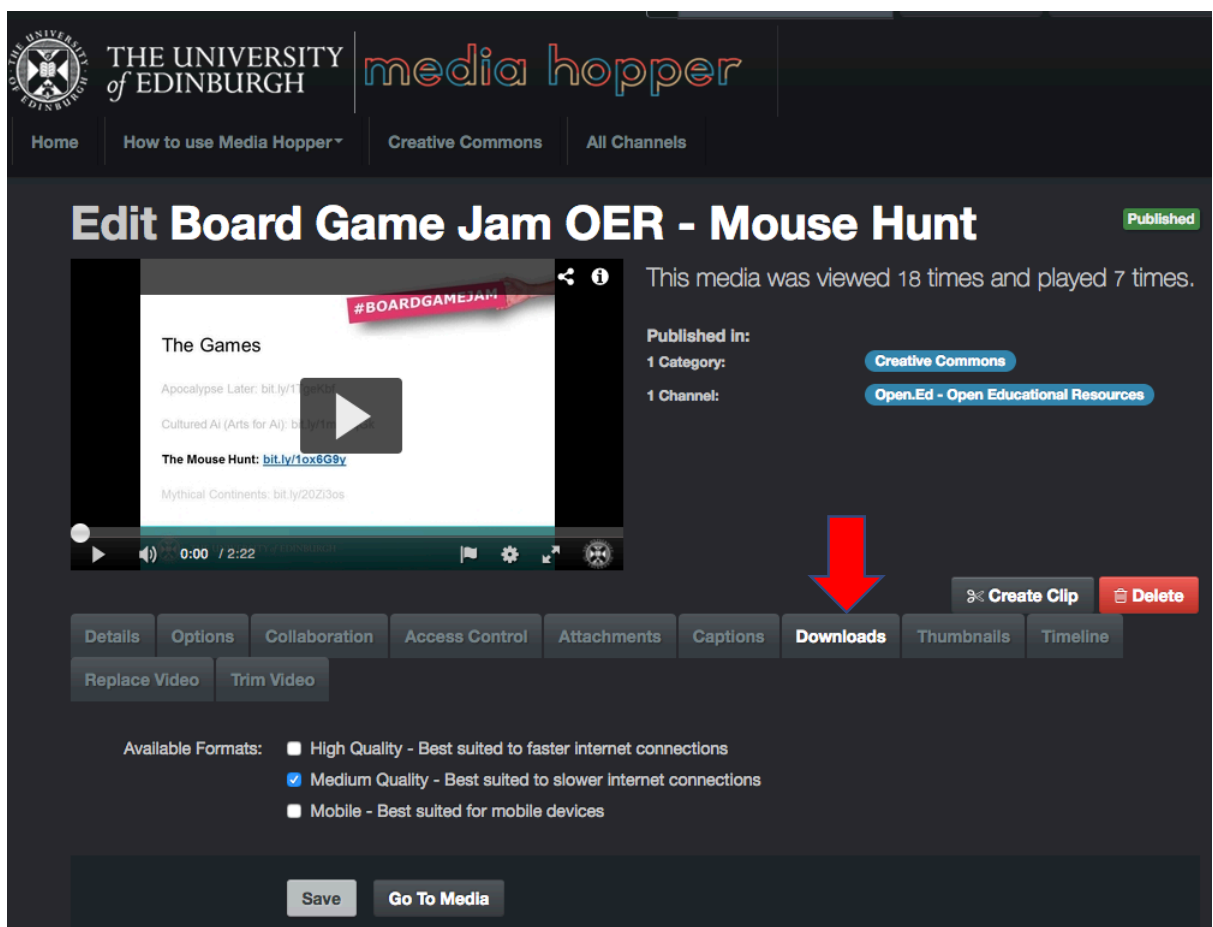
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3. Choose one of your media file to edit, then click on the grey 'Edit' button.



4. Underneath your media file you should find a toolbar with the following options: Details; Options; Collaboration; Access Control; Attachments; Captions; Downloads; Thumbnails; Timeline; Replace Video; Trim Video.

Click on the 'Downloads' tab.

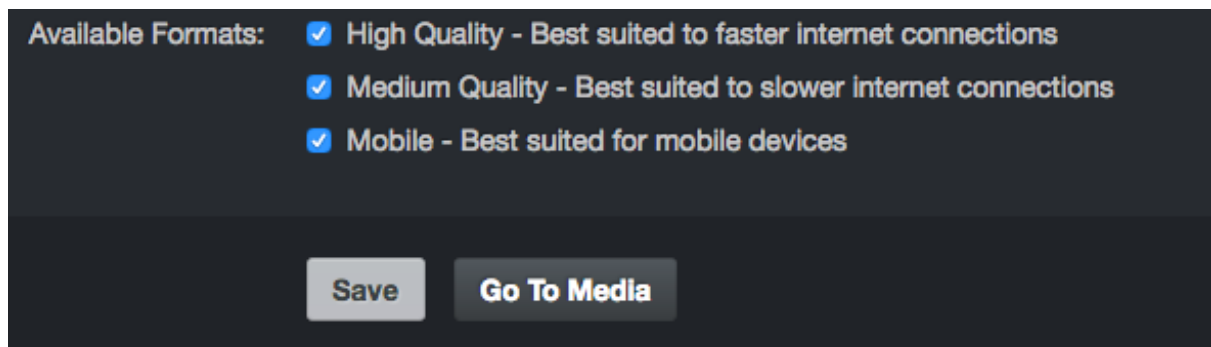


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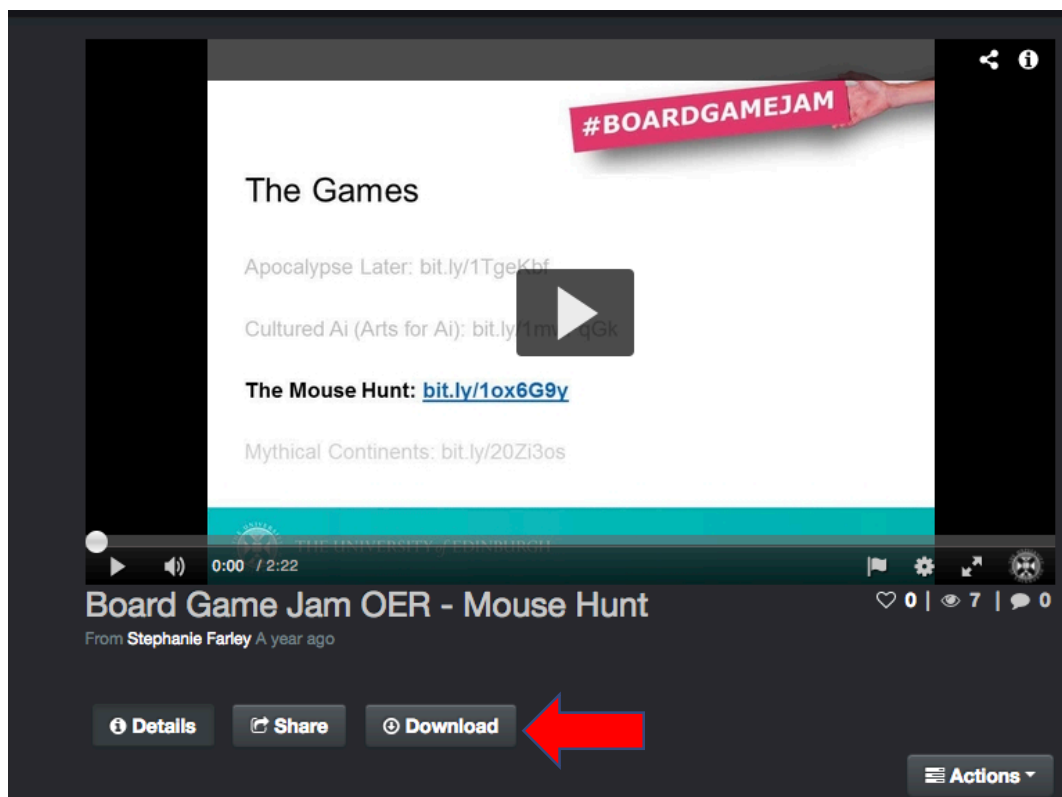
5. There are three format options you can choose to make your media available as for download. These are:

- High Quality – Best suited to faster internet connections
- Medium Quality – Best suited to slower internet connections
- Mobile – Best suited for mobile devices

You can select as many or all of these options. Once done click 'Save'.




6. To view your changes, click on 'Go To Media'. Underneath your video, next to the 'Details' and 'Share' buttons, there will now be a 'Download' button.



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If you only selected one available format, clicking on the download button will automatically start a download of your media in that one format.

If you selected two or more available formats, clicking on the download button will provide the user with those options. They can then click on and start the media download in the format of their choice.
